1. What's Happening In Your Area?

Disruption of Drug activity – Ongoing core priority

Drug taking and dealing in the streets around the town centre of Bridlington continue to be our focus. We continue to receive information and target areas of concern. Addresses with increased activity will be monitored adding to the intelligence picture. We continue to review this intelligence, obtain warrants, and target areas and individuals of concern using our stop and search powers. We continue to work with residents, Pro-active Patrols and BTP.

Operation Shield has led to numerous drug arrests. Clear, Hold, Build will further impact in this area.

Operation Yuletide / Shop Theft.

On the run up to Christmas we will continue with High Visibility patrols in high demand locations working alongside our Patrol officers to minimise incidents of Theft and ASB. We will be engaging with and supporting our shop keepers. We will be monitoring calls for service and using every opportunity to investigate incidents reported.



ASB – Town wide – Ongoing core priority

We continue to engage with the community and monitor areas subject to ASB.

We will conduct high visibility patrols and liaise with housing and social care. We are supporting local businesses with regular patrols and work with other agencies and children's homes to support youths and promote positive relationships. Liaison with schools continues. Local officers are working with housing and social services in relation to visiting youths and parents to minimise ASB.

Some youths have already been identified and we are utilising the fairway system to deal with this. We have signed youths up to Anti-Social Behaviour contracts and parents are aware of the issues they are causing. Any offences will be dealt with positively and we will look towards Youth Justice Service intervention where appropriate.

Humber Talking is still being undertaken in the Bridlington area. We will be adhering to social distancing guidance and will not be entering houses but speaking to members of the public who want to take part on their doorsteps. 3. Local News and General Information

03/11/2024 – RuralTaskForce - Following a report of hare coursing in Burton Agnes area, a male adult has been detained on private farm land & arrested for hare coursing related offences. 2 x dogs 1 x thermal 1 x radio 1 x phone all seized. Partnership response with Driffield Patrol Team1 officers, Farmwatch local community members & Humberside Fire & Rescue Service drone.



07/11/2024 – Operation Prowess - Last night, officers on OpProwess were patrolling around the streets of Bridlington, Beverley and Goole. Don't hesitate to stop and chat if you see any officer on the beat! We are here for you.

08/11/2024 - East Riding of Yorkshire council have obtained two full closure orders on properties in BRIDLINGTON following reports of Anti Social Behaviour and Criminal activity.

The full closure orders were granted by Beverley Magistrates Court on Friday the 8th November against a property on HARRINGTON ROAD, a semi detached property owned by East Riding Council, and a first floor flat on ABBOTTS WAY, also owned by the local authority.

The order means that no-one can enter either property for 3 months, except for officers from the council, Police, other emergency services and utility providers.



Anyone else who enters, or stays on the premises, without reasonable excuse can be fined, imprisoned or both. Beverley Magistrates Court heard from the councils Anti Social Behaviour Team that they had received complaints about both properties, which included drug dealing, drug use and disorderly conduct which spilled out onto the streets.

Activity at both properties had negatively affected the physical and mental health of the nearby residents and made some afraid to leave their homes.

Accordingly, the council sought full closure orders to protect the local community and prevent further harm. These were granted under Section 80 of the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014.

08/11/2024 - Minimal monstrous behaviour this Halloween and Bonfire period – Forcewide - There was very little monstrous behaviour in the Humberside force area this Halloween, and bonfire night weekend has gone out with a bang too.

A small minority acted in a way that was unacceptable, but as always, our neighbourhood, patrol and volunteer officers acted swiftly to deal with anyone who was trying to dampen the spirit of our local communities.

We received five reports of Halloween related antisocial behaviour (ASB) on Thursday 31 October, along with two crime investigations logged relating to Halloween and the 'Trick or treating' tradition.

There were 80 reports of Bonfire Night ASB related incidents from Friday 1 November to Tuesday 5 November, and the vast majority of these were calls regarding fires and fireworks in inappropriate

locations or being misused, which, again, were quickly dealt with by our officers and colleagues from Humberside Fire and Rescue Service. During this time, 21 crime investigations were also logged for bonfire or firework related incidents.

For those who did commit crimes within this period, our teams swiftly caught up with the people responsible and warned them about their behaviour. Some were also taken home and spoken to in front of their parents.

Superintendent Alex Weeks said: "The vast majority of people we met during this period were getting into the spirit of the occasion and it was great to see everyone coming together to enjoy themselves. However, we know the impact that antisocial behaviour can have on people – particularly those who are elderly or vulnerable, and that's why we arranged our shift patterns to have additional officers out on the streets and joined forces with the local councils, along with Humberside Fire and Rescue Service to deal with any issues that arose as quickly as possible".

6. Scams and Crime Prevention

Twelve Festive frauds to look out for

As part of our annual #OpYuletide messaging this year, we're launching our 12 festive frauds a little earlier in the lead up to the highly anticipated Black Friday and Cyber Monday sales.

In the three months leading up to Christmas last year, £140k was lost from online shopping fraud – that's an average of £715 per person!

A priority for our force, the seriousness of fraud needs to be reiterated, along with the financial and emotional impact it has on victims.

- 1) Cost of Living Scams Today we're urging you to be on your guard against those operating cost of living scams like falsely offering grants or scam energy discount texts.
- 2) **Investment Fraud -** Investment fraud is where criminals will present professional and credible looking online adverts, send emails, and create websites to advertise fake investment opportunities.
- 3) **Charity Fraud -** Are you donating to charity this Christmas? Don't let your money end up in a criminal's pocket.
- 4) **Pet Fraud –** Do your research, Trust your instincts and choose you payment method wisely
- 5) Remote Access Scams Never allow remote access to your computer following an unsolicited call, text message or browser pop-up. It's probably a scam.
- 6) **Phishing -** Received a suspicious message that you're unsure about? Fake messages can be difficult to spot, and criminals put in a lot of effort to make their communication look legitimate so it's important to take your time and not act too quickly.



- 7) Romance Fraud Met someone online who's asking you for money? Criminals are experts at impersonating people. They spend hours researching you for their scams, especially when committing romance fraud.
- 8) **Online Shopping Fraud -** Fraudsters can take advantage of you hunting for bargains and could steal thousands of pounds on average from each victim.
- 9) **Courier Fraud** Courier fraud is when victims receive a phone call from a criminal who is pretending to be a police officer or bank official.
- 10) **Ticket Fraud -** Only buy tickets from the venue's box office, official promoter or agent, or a well-known and reputable ticket site.
- 11) Cloned Companies Fraud Cloned company scams affect both new and experienced investors. Fraudsters are impersonating the websites of real firms offering investments in stocks, cryptocurrency, and ISA's.
- 12) **Holiday Fraud -** Don't be tempted by too good to be true deals on flights and accommodation. If something sounds too good to be true, it usually is!

Watch out for fraudsters selling FAKE Coldplay Tickets

Only buy tickets from the venue's box office, the promoter, an official agent or a well-known and reputable ticket exchange site.

Fraudsters create fake websites, clone/hack friends on social media, use various platforms like Facebook Marketplace to try and sell fake concert tickets.

Ticket Fraud Remember to buy tickets only from the venue's box office, sports club, promoter, official agent or reputable ticket exchange sites. Consider paying by credit card to get additional protection over other payment methods. Warrietplace to try and sell fake concert tickets. HMRC's top tips for avoiding scams are:

- Recognise the signs genuine organisations like banks and HMRC will never contact you out of the blue to ask for your PIN, password or bank details.
- Stay safe don't give out private information, reply to text messages, download attachments or click on links in emails you weren't expecting.
- Take action forward suspicious emails claiming to be from HMRC to <u>phishing@hmrc.gsi.gov.uk</u> and texts to 60599, or contact Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040 to report any suspicious calls or use their <u>online fraud reporting tool</u>.
- HMRC Debt management teams do contact members of the public by phone about paying outstanding debts.
- If a customer (or agent) isn't confident that the call is from HMRC, we will ask them to call back.
 Depending on the circumstances and to give the customer confidence it is actually HMRC calling, information may be disclosed to the caller which only HMRC is party to
- Calls from the majority of HMRC offices will leave caller identification data, i.e. the number the caller has used to contact you from

Never click on a link and if in doubt make your own independent enquiries.


