1. What's Happening In Your Area?

Disruption of Drug activity – Ongoing core priority

Drug taking and dealing in the streets around the town centre of Bridlington continue to be our focus. We continue to receive information and target areas of concern. Addresses with increased activity will be monitored adding to the intelligence picture. We continue to review this intelligence, obtain warrants, and target areas and individuals of concern using our stop and search powers. We continue to work with residents, Pro-active Patrols and BTP.

Operation Shield continues to lead to numerous drug arrests. Clear, Hold, Build will further impact in this area.

ASB including nuisance motorbikes – Town wide – Ongoing core priority

We continue to engage with the community and monitor areas subject to ASB. Currently 3 hotspot areas have been identified as Alderson Court, Remembrance Court and Britannia Road as well as town-wide issues with off-road motorbikes.

We will conduct high visibility patrols and liaise with housing and social care. We are supporting local businesses with regular patrols and work with other agencies and children's homes to support



youths and promote positive relationships. Liaison with schools continues. Local officers are working with housing and social services in relation to visiting youths and parents to minimise ASB.

Operation Yellowfin will be carrying out patrols in the areas affected.

Shop Theft – We will continue to address high demand locations. Work is ongoing with retail premises in the area of Promenade, St Johns Street and Hilderthorpe Road. We will, by default, carry out high visibility foot patrols in these areas and will deal with any offences positively in conjunction with our Patrol colleagues. We continue to liaise with shop managers offering assistance and crime prevention advice.

Humber Talking is still being undertaken in the Bridlington area.

3. Local News and General Information

01/03/2025 - Last night the Rural Task force assisted Patrol colleagues searching for a missing person along the Flamborough coastline. Our Polaris allowed for hard-to-reach off-road areas to be checked. Pleased to say the person was located safe and well.







06/03/2025 - We are aware that nuisance motorcycles continue to cause issues in the town.

Several reports have been received this evening and Neighbourhood officers have been out and about, trying to deter offences and catch those responsible. This is not an easy task however we are determined to reduce the number of incidents involving such machines. Tonight, Neighbourhood officers managed to seize this motorcycle, after the riders tried to hide the bike from Police. It has since been seized and the owner has now lost their prized possession forever.

We are also working closely with our partners, who have the ability to take positive action against tenants, should they be linked to anti-social behaviour, especially that involving the use of illegal motorcycles.

14/03/2025 - Coastal drugs conspirators convicted

Twelve people have been sentenced to a combined total of 37 years and six months for their involvement in an organised crime group (OCG) operating across Bridlington that resulted in more than £3million worth of crack cocaine being sold during the time the conspirators were operating.

Following a complex investigation lasting over eight months, all twelve were charged with multiple drugs offences and eventually pleaded guilty.

Three of the principal members were:

Liam Langton, 27-years-old, of Greetwell Road in Lincoln, pleaded guilty to conspiracy to supply class A drugs and being concerned in the supply of class B drugs. He has been sentenced to seven years and two months

Lee Jenkinson, 32-years-old, of Market Walk in Driffield pleaded guilty to conspiracy to supply class A drugs and has been sentenced to four years

Luke Gilson, 35-years-old, of Burstall Hill in Bridlington pleaded guilty to conspiracy to supply class A drugs and supplying class A drugs. He has been sentenced to six years and four months

19/03/2025 - Man charged following criminal damage in Bridlington - A man has been charged after officers were called to reports of criminal damage in Bridlington on Thursday, 19 March.

lan Newall, 69-years-old, of St Mary's Crescent, Bridlington, has been charged with two counts of criminal damage and two counts of assault of an emergency worker.

He has been released on conditional bail to appear at Hull Magistrates Court on Monday, 7 April.

It is reported at around 3.15pm that a man had caused damage to windows and doors of a property on Bow Street. Whilst being detained, the man is then believed to have assaulted officers.

20/03/2025 - Man in custody following reports of criminal damage - A man has been arrested after officers were called to reports of a male causing damage to windows and doors of a property on Bow Street in Bridlington at around 3.15pm on Thursday, 20 March.

Officers attended, and a 69-year-old man was arrested at the scene on suspicion of criminal damage.



Whilst being detained, the man is then believed to have used racially abusive language towards an officer before allegedly spitting at them.


He was further arrested on suspicion of racially aggravated and violent language and remains in police custody assisting with ongoing enquiries at this time.

5. Scams and Crime Prevention

02/04/2025 - Developing crime pattern in neighbouring ward areas

We would like to bring your attention to two crimes that may be linked. On the 2nd of April around 0045hrs keys to two vehicles were stolen from an address in Nafferton. One vehicle was found nearby and the second is still outstanding. Occurrence no 25*43909 refers.

In the early hours of the same morning, around 0230hrs two males were disturbed tampering with a lock at an address in Hutton Cranswick. Occurrence no 25*43916

We would ask you to review your security, ensure ALL doors and windows are locked and consider where you leave your vehicle keys overnight.

14/03/2025 – Officers from the Rural Task Force have been carrying out reassurance patrols and house to house enquiries in Sancton and surrounding villages regarding recent thefts of Heating Oil in the area. We ask that **Bridlington residents**, who use heating oil, consider their security and report anything suspicious.



There are steps you can take to keep your oil tank safe:

- Hide the location of the tank
- Fit your oil tank with a padlock or lockable filler cap
- Secure the oil tank within a cage
- Install lockable gates
- Fit an electronic gauge, which can activate an alarm when the oil level drops
- Fit security lights near to the oil tank location
- Fit CCTV cameras

19/03/2025 - Thefts from building sites and properties being renovated

Recently we have seen a spate of thefts from building sites and properties under renovation.

We are encouraging members of the public to report anything suspicious, especially if someone is seen paying attention to certain properties or equipment on or around building sites.

The items that are being targeted include -

- Plant equipment
- · Tools that are left on site.
- Diesel Fuel.
- Building supplies.



If you are offered items at a considerably reduced price, please consider that they may be stolen and contact Humberside Police to report it.

If you own, manage or work on a building site and you are concerned about security, construction site security information is available in this guide.

If you are renovating a property, ensure that you consider the following advice to reduce the risk that the property is targeted.

- Keep the exterior well light at night using dusk to dawn lighting and warning signs.
- Store your valuables in a secure place, like a safe or behind locked doors in rooms that aren't part of the remodel.
- Use property marking. https://www.securedbydesign.com/images/property-marking.pdf
- Ensure the area around the house is clean and free of building materials and easily accessible tools Talk with the contractors. Learn what their policy and practices are when it comes to tools and building materials and take an active interest in how they are keeping items secure.
- If you are staying somewhere else during the construction, consider using a surveillance system to monitor the activities while you are gone.
- Be onsite, but out of the way as much as possible. Drive by the property and check up on things. Make surprise visits to the house, this will let any dishonest workers know that you could show up anytime.

HMRC's top tips for avoiding scams are:

 Recognise the signs - genuine organisations like banks and HMRC will never contact you out of the blue to ask for your PIN, password or bank details.



- Stay safe don't give out private information, reply to text messages, download attachments or click on links in emails you weren't expecting.
- Take action forward suspicious emails claiming to be from HMRC to <u>phishing@hmrc.gsi.gov.uk</u> and texts to 60599, or contact Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040 to report any suspicious calls or use their <u>online fraud reporting tool</u>.
- HMRC Debt management teams do contact members of the public by phone about paying outstanding debts.
- If a customer (or agent) isn't confident that the call is from HMRC, we will ask them to call back. Depending on the circumstances and to give the customer confidence it is actually HMRC calling, information may be disclosed to the caller which only HMRC is party to
- Calls from the majority of HMRC offices will leave caller identification data, i.e. the number the caller has used to contact you from

Never click on a link and if in doubt make your own independent enquiries.


